# MY CANDADICY/PLATFORM

What distinguishes my candidacy and campaign from the other candidates for this office?

My campaign message will be on the importance of giving town residents an equal voice. By being approachable and open, I will make residents comfortable sharing their ideas, concerns and thoughts.

I have a unique background with experience working in large corporations and for powerful families. I will bring my unique employment experience with me not only to the campaign, but also to serve me in the role. I've worked as a facilitator in Autodesk's Executive Briefing Center, and I've

planned client functions for Ferrari. I was Michael Mondavi's Executive Assistant for two years and I've worked for a Trust attorney and a financial advisor. This varied experience will enable me to understand various perspectives on issues and to think on my feet. The most unique thing about me is that I've been a professional singer and entertainer since I was in my early 20s. I am at ease communicating to crowds. I do hope the decades of experience I have on stage will support me as I am meeting many new people during the campaign.

What do you see as the major issues and their possible solutions in this campaign?

Most certainly a key issue for the entire valley right now is affordable housing. Focusing on Yountville only, I would support expansion of housing in certain places on the Yountville Elementary School campus grounds, once the Town is able to transfer ownership from the school district, and I'm also interested in understanding how additional affordable housing can be added on the grounds of the Veterans Home of California, so employees working at the home would have a local affordable place to reside.

Water is an ongoing issue, and I feel continued awareness of town guidelines is needed - though I will add that water usage is down 42.3% for two of the largest neighborhoods in town.
